## Inspections

Two areas which have arisen from children's homes inspections in England recently:-

- Challenge around the knowledge and understanding of the education provision for young people particularly, when an alternative provision is involved. Are managers and teams fully aware of the education-based targets which young people should be studying and their alignment to subjects such as literacy and numeracy/ Maths and English
- Supervision-again this has been linked to the frequency of supervision and it's alignment to the policy of the organisation, and the effectiveness/ robustness of supervision in terms of improving practice and outcomes for children and young people. Gather clear evidence of supervision, reflection, improvement targets, practice, reflection, changes in outcomes for children and young people etc
