Keeping children Close

- Staying Close to friends and family
- Continuity in education and access to local resources
- Higher chance of reunification (if appropriate)
- Stops children feeling lonely and isolated
- Builds strong community ties
- Helps children build memories
- Reduces social work travel time
- Effective solutions for collaborative working across professionals
- It's the right thing to do for children

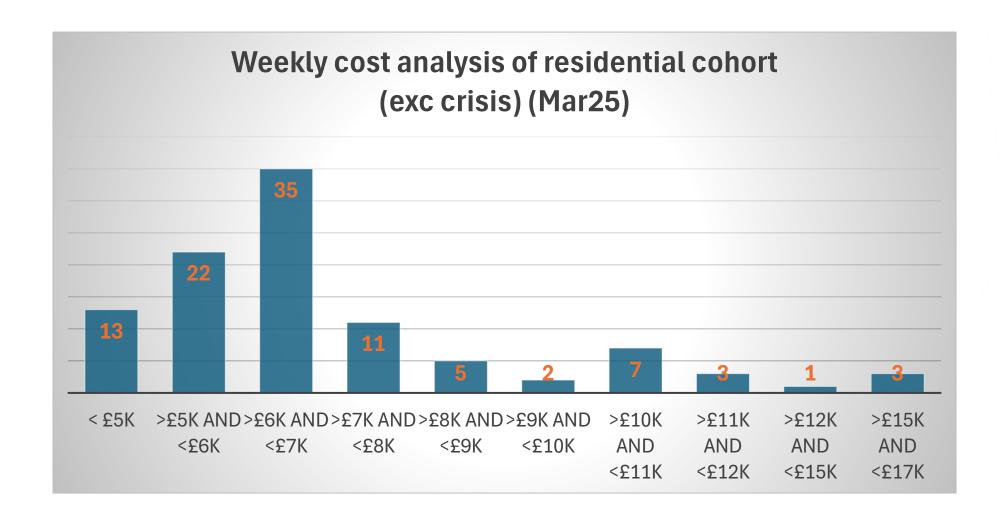

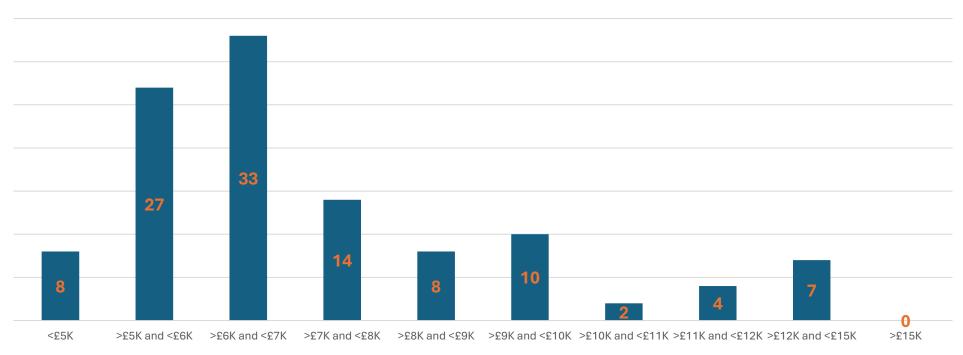
Basic cost analysis (April 25)

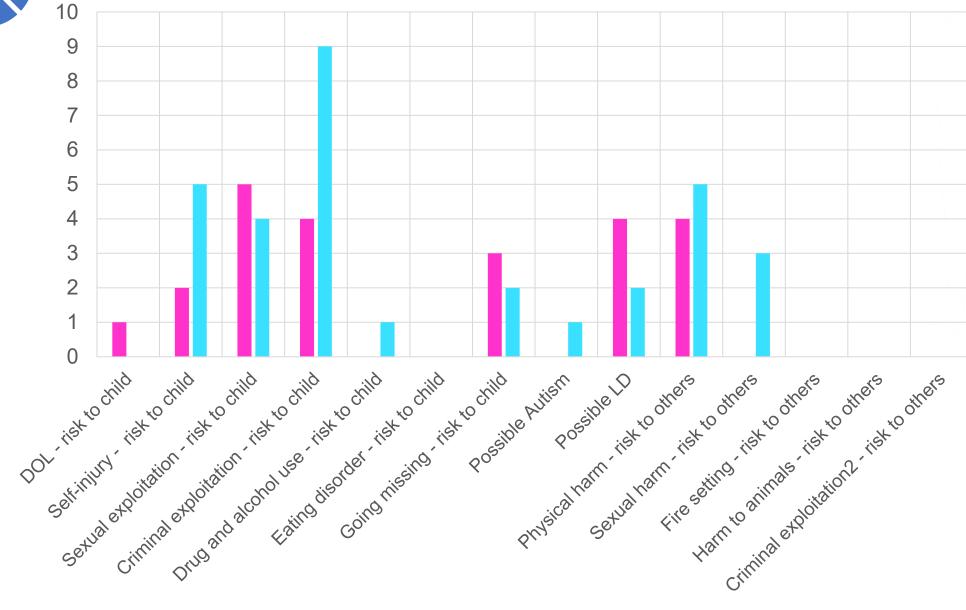

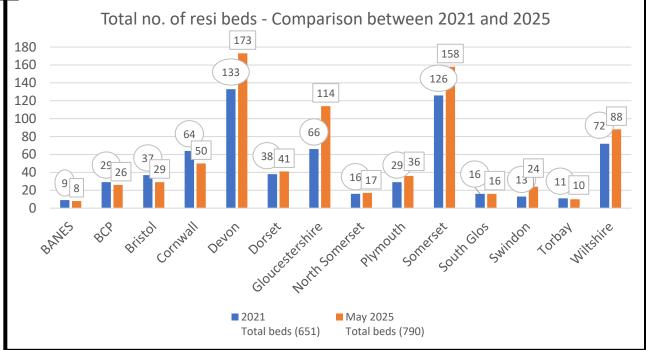

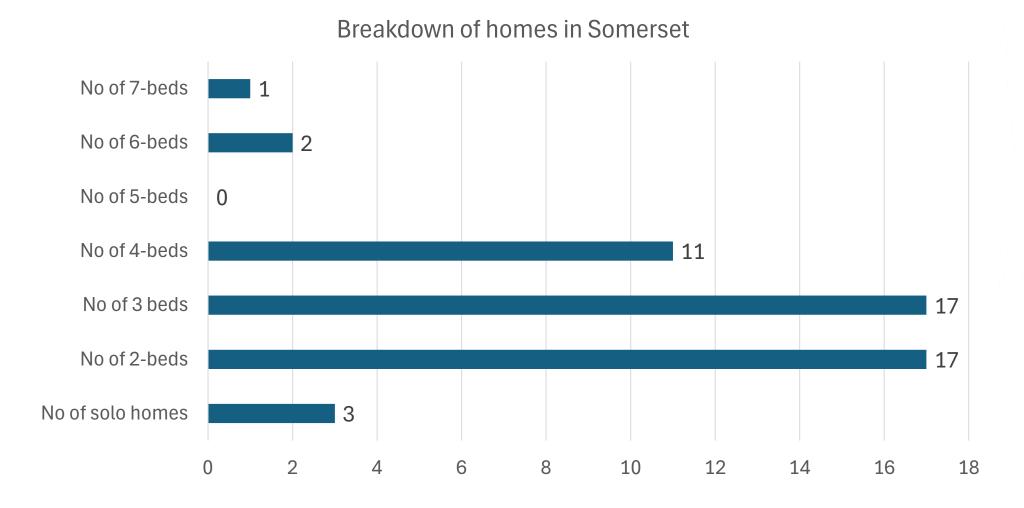


Residential growth in the South West

Breakdown of homes in Somerset





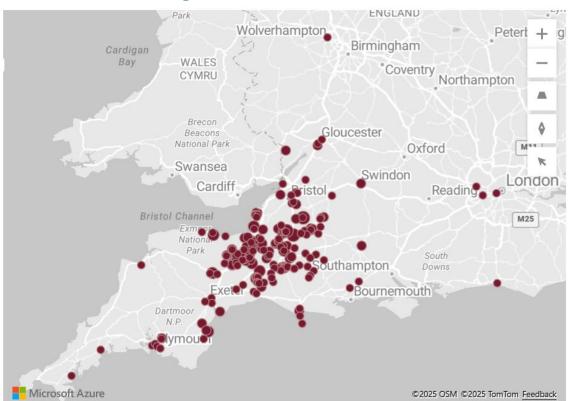




Summary

- Although CLA numbers have increased we are low in comparison to our statistical neighbours
- ~23 children living in residential homes purely due to a lack of fostering
 - Examples of profiles on tables
- Children living in residential 50/122 children living in Somerset, 72 are living out of County

Our children living in residential homes









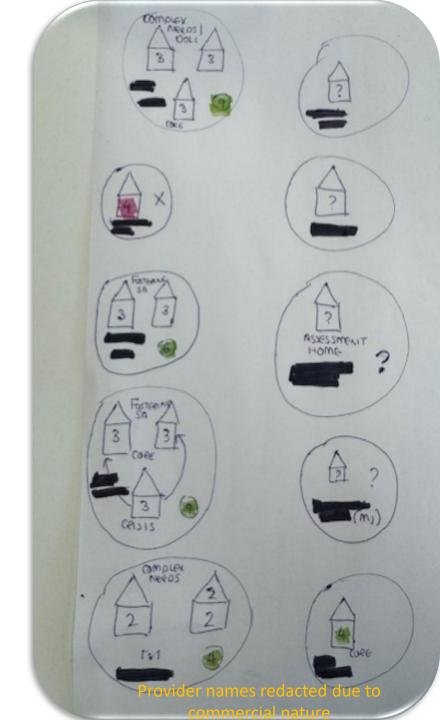
- Segmentation work identified our 'ethical' providers
- Helped us understand use of providers backed by private equity
- Held meetings with around 20 providers some face to face to see their homes – helped us understand growth

Findings

- Couple providers are looking into 'Employee owned trusts'
- Majority not wanting block arrangements
- Prefer an 'open and transparent' relationship with Somerset
- Want to be paid promptly!
- Staffing models are driving costs up South West feels different to other regions

Next steps

- Conference held in may
 - Launched resi step across to fostering encourage collaboration
 - Develop flexi-block ts and cs/procurement approach
 - Write up residential strategy
 - Vision is for more children to be living in Somerset
 - "Keeping children close"

Capability & Opportunity

How much control & opportunity providers have to work and support Devon County Council, including:

- Size/type of Provider
- How established are they in the market
- Number of carers available
- Resource to recruit

Motivation

How motivated providers are to strengthen their working relationship with Devon County Council, including:

- How much business they need
- Their existing relationship and previous engagement with us

High

Strategic

Providers well established in the market, and have the resource & capacity to recruit however, we are not their LA of choice and engagement has been low

Capability & opportunity

Disengaged

Providers who are not engaged with us and do not have carers to match.

Nurture

Providers who are highly motivated to work with us and have the capability and opportunities to be able to do so. E.g. they frequently recruit and match with us and attend our engagement sessions

Support

Providers who are eager to work with us (perhaps new to the market or smaller) however we suspect they don't have carers available and don't have much capacity to recruit specifically for us

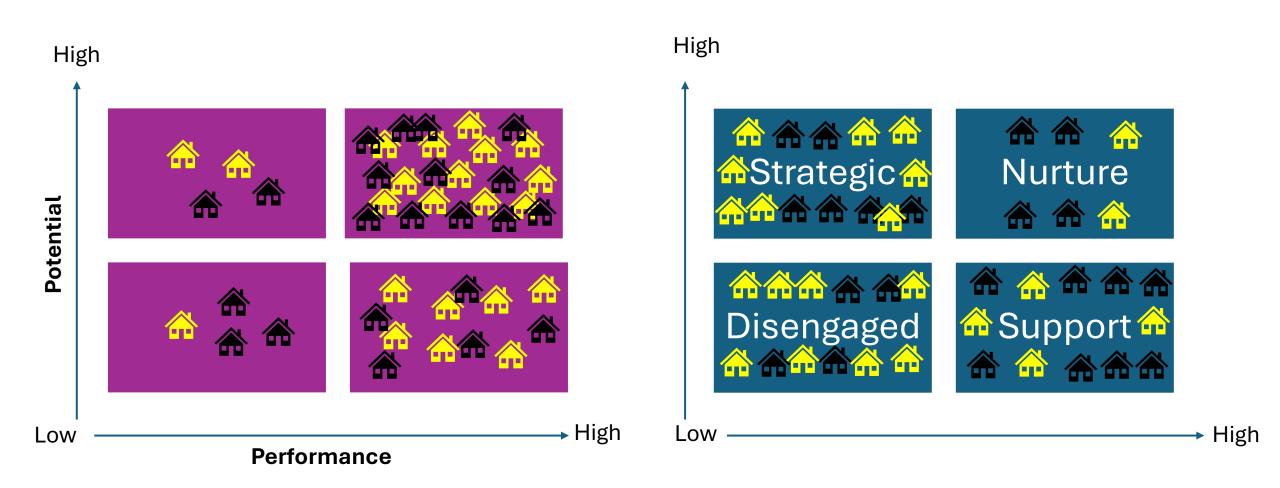
