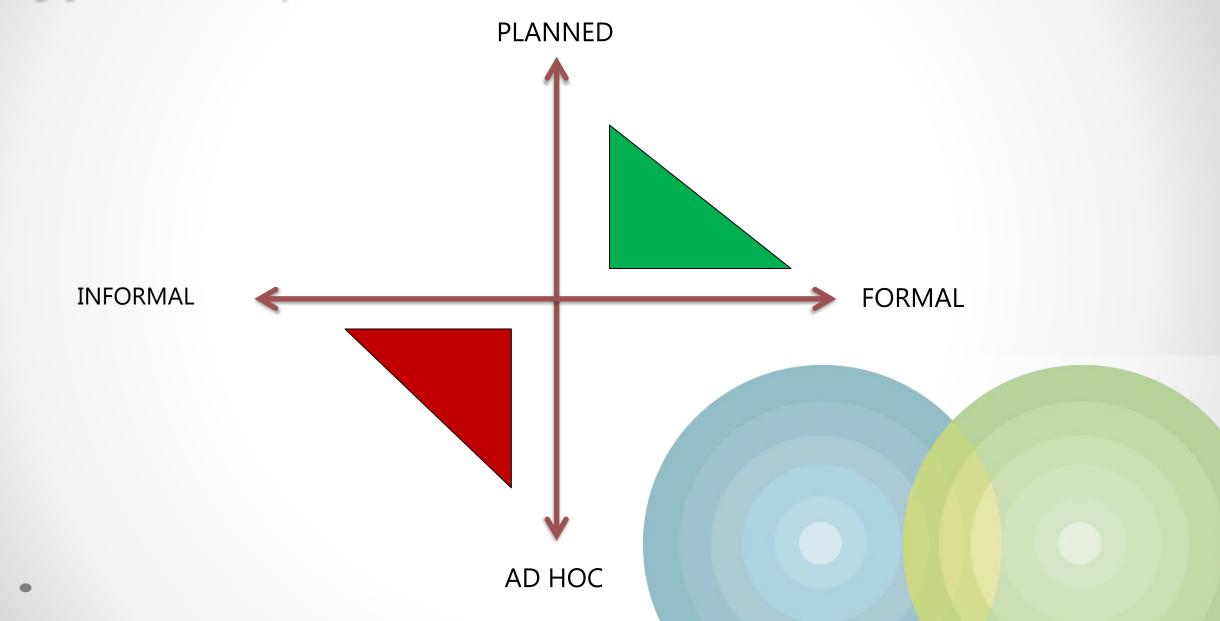

an accountable process which supports assures and develops the knowledge, skills and values of an individual, group or team. The purpose is to improve the quality of their work to achieve agreed outcomes and develops and progresses the worker

types of supervision...?



Supervision

- Occurs on a regular basis
- An opportunity for employees to spend some time with their manager to discuss how things are going with work and wellbeing
- Supervisions are an opportunity to identify any new development opportunities such as buddying
- Objectives set at appraisals or previous supervision should be reviewed at supervisions to ensure they are being progressed

Benefits of Supervision

- Improved staff morale and wellbeing
- Enhanced quality of care for residents
- Increased staff competence through learning and development
- Better communications between leaders and staff
- Effective problem solving
- Helps to address any issues in a timely way and celebrate achievements

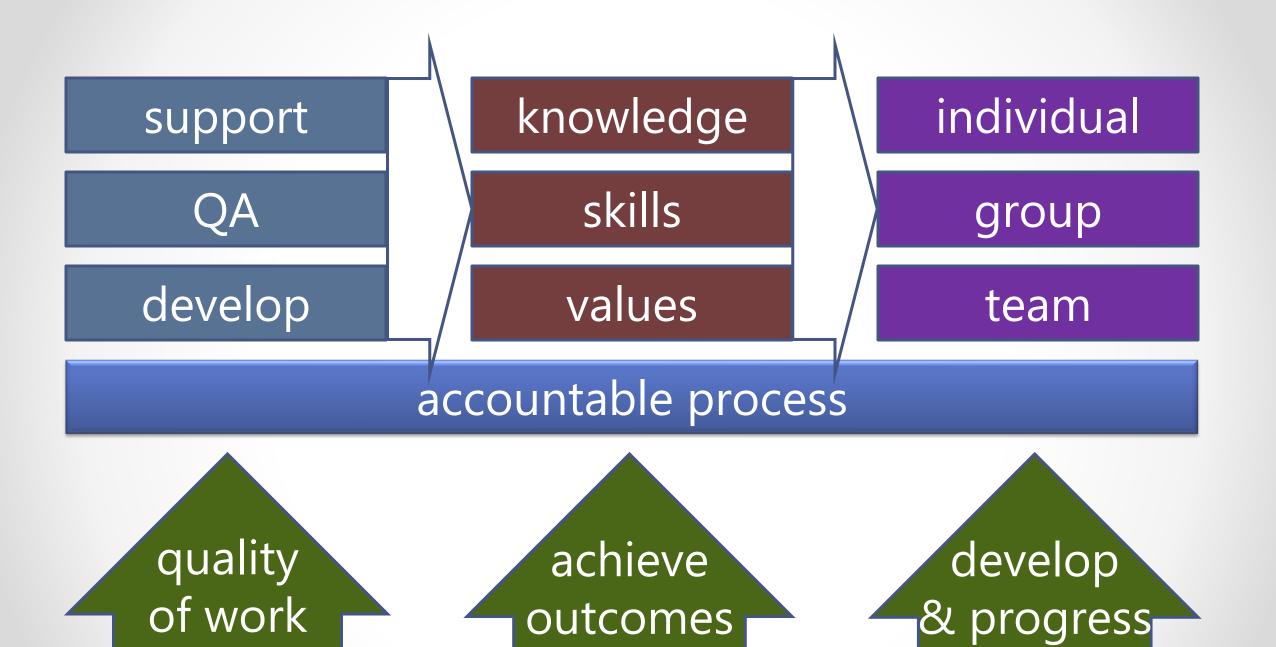

Elements of good supervision

- regular & challenging, but supportive
- relevant & probing
- factual & reflective
- acknowledge personal impacts: fear of loss and grief,
 emotional pain, cultural difference etc.,
- set priorities (and no not every thing can be a priority)

Lientents of good supervision - processes.

- An organisational policy
- A supervision contract between the supervisor and the supervisee
- A standardised agenda that can be added to by either party
- A standardised template for recording supervision discussions
- Regularity and booked in advance

SUPERVISOR

- 1. Flexibility of approach -right time right approach
- 2. Multi perspectival view
- 3. A working map of the discipline in which they supervise
- 4. The ability to work transculturally
- 5. The capacity to manage and contain anxiety
- 6. Openness to learning
- 7. Sensitivity to wider contextual issues
- 8. Can handle power appropriately
- 9. Humour, humility and patience
- 10. Resilience and Persistence
