

# Electronic Monitoring



#### How did we get here?

- Ofcom Children and Parents Media Use and Attitudes Report (April 2024)
- Children are more likely to be 'passive' than 'active' users of social media Tik Tok is the most popular.
- Five to seven year olds are more increasingly present online which may pose greater risk. Social media, online gaming, live streaming, Tik Tok, Discord etc.
- Only a third of parents know the correct minimum age requirement for most social media platforms.
- Do you?

# Residential settings

Challenges - inherited problems.

Difficulty with parental settings.

Children are very savvy.

Doubt over what we can and cannot do.

Unsure of the correct frameworks.

#### Ideal

Clearly outlined working practice - statement of purpose, core documents.

For monitoring such as CCTV, Qustodio, Apple parent - clear consent and agreement to care planning.

Consistently review the effectiveness and necessity of the measure.

Involve everyone - especially the child.

#### Human rights

Freedom of expression

Right to education

Right to participation

Right to interdependence (appointments, online banking etc.)

#### Negative impact

Privacy?

Freedom of expression can lead to more concerning habits and may have legal implications.

Pressure and status (Instafame, Tik Tok fame)

Mental health and self-esteem.

#### Exploitation

NSPCC 6,350 offences of 'sexual communication with a child' in March 2023 online.

That is an 82% increase compared to 2017/2018.

Roughly 48% of recorded 2023 - 2024 offences involved the app Snapchat.

What would a parent do?

Safe?

Can we do it?

The Children's Act - Section 11, Section 33

## Suspecting a crime?

Crime and policing bill (2025)

Criminal offence for anyone who carries out a 'relevant internet activity' with the intention of facilitating exploitation or abuse.

Coerced internal concealment.

Intent!!!!!! How we record and report!

The facilitation of this will also come under scruting (Online Safety Act) - Tech giants are legally responsible!

Recording, reporting, and action

Duty of candour!

Reporting child sexual abuse

Listen to our children

#### Impact on the child

Children need to be cocreators of safety This needs to be managed with children rather than 'to them'

We have a duty to understand the contexts with which our children move and spend time - including online space.

Is it reasonable and proportionate to monitor a child?


